

1. Answers will vary. Students should understand that egg-laying mammals are rare; therefore, the eggs are probably not mammalian.
2. Classifying mammals based on how they reproduce is one of the major methods of forming animal subclasses.

3. Answers will vary. Students might answer that the broad range of reproductive methods used by mammals indicates the wide diversity of species within the animal classes.
